This Report submits that the US asylum adjudication process has been invaded by foreign and domestic policy considerations. The Refugee Act of 1980 established an entitlement to political asylum in the US based on ideological neutral standards which coincide with the eligibility standard codified in the 1967 UN Protocol relating to the status of refugees. Although the 1980 Act was drafted to remove domestic and foreign policy factors from the asylum process, statistics reveal that these factors continue to dominate asylum adjudications. Due to their limited training, immigration

judges rely almost exclusively upon the required 'advisory' opinions issued by the State Department regarding whether the applicant is entitled to refugee status. Consequently, asylum grants for applicants who flee from communist regimes overwhelmingly outnumber grants to those who flee regimes with which the US has good relations, despite their human rights record. Domestic policy considerations have entered the asylum process. The US established an interdiction programme which permits the Coast Guard to intercept vessels on the high seas and return asylum seekers bound for the US to their home countries. Without access to counsel and meaningful review, these aliens have no chance to identify themselves as refugees and

receive protection from refoulement. The US has initiated an alien detention policy which has resulted in prolonged detention for many who should be considered bona fide refugees. He maintains that an applicant for asylum will prevail over an adverse State Department advisory opinion if he can establish a well-founded fear of persecution if returned to his country of origin. I argue that the asylum process entails a "paradox of visibility" : asylum
